## City's 35th Anniversary to Conclude with a Holiday Sing-A-Long

The City turns 35 on Sunday, December 11, 2016 and in honor of that occasion, the City will be hosting a Holiday Sing-a-Long in partnership with The Shoppes at Westlake Village. The sing-a-long will begin at 4:00 pm and conclude with a fountain display and a tree lighting at approximately 5:15 pm. The event will be held in the Fountain Courtyard in front of Jeannine's. Special activities will include a toy drive for Casa Pacifica and a canned food drive for Manna with drop offs available from 3-6:00 pm. Other activities include a balloon artist and cookie decorating area. The sing-a-long will feature a choir made up of local residents and students and a house band full of local musicians. In addition, local community leaders and business owners will have the opportunity to lead the singing of fun winter tunes.

For this special event, residents may board the Holiday Trolley beginning at 1:00 pm with a special neighborhood route to take people to and from the event. The trolley will run three hours before and after the event to allow for dining and shopping opportunities for attendees. The event will occur rain or shine, and some special 35th Anniversary umbrellas will be available to the first 200 attendees.

### Brand New Senior Genius Club

Do you have a new cell phone or lap top that you just cannot seem to master? Do you need help installing programs or apps? Do you want to connect with family or friends on Facebook, Instagram, or Twitter but have

no idea where to start? Could you just use a little refresher course in Excel or Word? A brand new program called the Senior Genius Club will be offered on the first and third Tuesdays of the month at Agoura High School's remodeled Media Center from 3:30 - 5:30 pm. Agoura High School is located at 28545 W. Driver Ave, Agoura Hills, CA 91301. Follow the parking lot signs to find the location. The parking area and room are wheelchair and walker-accessible, however, there is a short walk to get to the center.

Help will be offered in thirty minute increments for one topic at a time. The "tech experts" are high school students who are earning volunteer hours while serving their community. The service is free and open to all ages that may need some technological help.

Upcoming dates are November 1 and 15 and December 6 and 13 to

### Senior and Disabled Dial-A-Ride

Dial-A-Ride is a service for residents over the age of 65 or those with a disability that prevents them from driving. Rides are available throughout the Cities of Westlake Village and Thousand Oaks. Dial-A-Ride also provides limited service for medical or employment related trips to Agoura Hills. Eligible residents need to obtain a free Dial-A-Ride card from City Hall. The City offers the program through a contract agreement with the City of Thousand Oaks with service 7 days a week. # Notify Me- How Do I Sign Up for Information About the City?

Did you know that the City's website can be used to alert you to specific events or topics? Emails or text messages containing topics such as Emergency Alerts, press releases, public notices, updates on roadwork, recreation programs, transportation, and more can be automatically sent to you by registering with the City's website under the "Notify Me" button on the home page. Users can select which topics or events to be notified of by simply entering an email address or mobile number and then clicking on the topics of interest. Users may change their topics of interest or unsubscribe at any time. ## 2017 Grants Offered for Community and Cultural Organizations

The City is now accepting applications for the 2017 Community Service Grant Program. The City recognizes the value of local organizations that provide specialized social services and cultural programs benefitting our citizens. A total of \$100,000 is earmarked for this year's Community Service Grant Program, and of this amount, \$40,000 has been set aside to support public schools. Not-for-profit organizations that serve the residents of the greater City of Westlake Village community are eligible to apply.

This year, applications will be submitted in an online-only format. Application forms and information are available by visiting [www.wlv.org](http://www.wlv.org) and clicking on the "Community Service Grant Fund" icon on the left hand side. All required forms must be submitted by Friday, January 29, 2017 at 5:00 pm. Proposals will be evaluated by a City Council appointed committee, and grants will be awarded by the City Council on a competitive basis. ## City Seeking Applicants to Serve on New Public Safety Advisory Board

The City is seeking applications from Westlake Village residents interested in serving on its new Public Safety Advisory Board. The City Council approved the formation of the board and adopted the bylaws for the advisory group at its September 28 regular meeting.

The purpose of the new board is to assist the City in raising the overall level of awareness and importance of public safety throughout the community. The newly established bylaws call for the board to meet on a quarterly basis. Among other responsibilities, it will promote public safety education and provide recommendations to the City Council on a wide range of public safety issues, including: community law enforcement, crime prevention, and police and community relationships; City infrastructure needs and priorities related to streets, sidewalks, and trails; traffic safety-related matters; and public safety issues affecting pedestrians and cyclists.

Along with two Councilmembers, the board will be comprised of seven residents to be appointed by the City Council. The terms of the seven residents will be staggered with three members serving an initial term of two years and four members serving initial terms of four years. The regular terms of all subsequent members will be four years.

Residents interested in applying to serve on the Public Safety Advisory Board are asked to complete a City application form. To request an application, either contact the City Hall offices by phone at 818-706-1613, or stop by City Hall located at 31200 Oak Crest Drive.
