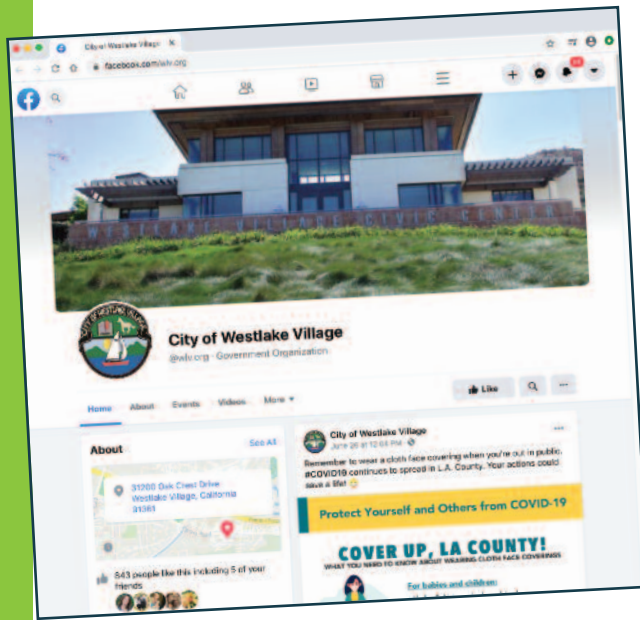

WLV Dog Park Reopens July 1

The Westlake Village Dog Park will re-open for limited use on July 1. In accordance with guidance from State and Los Angeles County health officials to prevent the spread of COVID-19, the Dog Park is open with the following restrictions:

- 🐾 Physical distancing of a minimum of six (6) feet is required, including the use of the shade shelter and park benches.
- 🐾 Please do not gather with others.
- 🐾 Wear cloth face coverings per the CDC guidelines.
- 🐾 The use of gloves to open and close all gates is strongly encouraged.
- 🐾 All fountains are temporarily shut off, bring water for you and your pet.
- 🐾 Bring hand sanitizer or disinfecting wipes and sanitize hands frequently.
- 🐾 Avoid petting other people's dogs.
- 🐾 Stay home if you are sick.

Please keep in mind all these restrictions when visiting the dog park to ensure that it remains open. For more information visit www.WLV.org/dogpark or call (818) 706-1613.

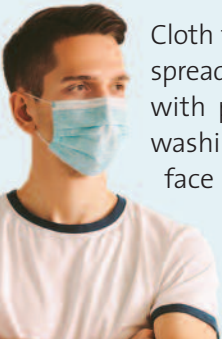


Status of CITY PARKS

As of July 1, the Westlake Village Community Park's Skate Park and all park restrooms will re-open. Park restrooms will be open during park hours and cleaned twice daily. Please remember to follow public health orders when using the parks:

- ⇄ Do not come to the park if you are feeling sick.
- ⇄ Practice good hygiene - wear gloves, frequent handwashing, and use sanitizers.
- ⇄ Please maintain at least 6 feet of physical separation between you and people outside your household.
- ⇄ Please do not gather with others.

Face Coverings Required In Public Spaces



Cloth face coverings or masks help reduce the spread of coronavirus especially when combined with physical distancing and frequent hand washing. As of June 18, Californians must wear face coverings in common and public indoor spaces and outdoors when distancing is not possible. EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020

Westlake Village park users are required to continue social distancing by keeping physical distances of a minimum of 6 feet, not congregating as a group at City parks, and wearing cloth face coverings per the CDC guidelines.

PET SAFETY TIPS

With the weather starting to warm up and residents spending more times outdoors, the City would like to remind you of some important safety tips regarding your pets. These tips are for both the safety of the pet as well as residents who may need to interact with an escaped pet or wildlife.



- **ID** Microchipping can be an easy and quick way to help locate lost pets. Pet owners need to make sure they register their pet's microchip. Information should be updated each time a person moves, changes their phone number, or e-mail address. Pet licenses are required in the City for both dogs and cats. Pet licenses are available at the LA County Animal Control Agoura Shelter.
- **VEHICLES** Never leave your pets unattended inside a parked car, even with the windows rolled down a few inches. This is against state law and can result in legal action or broken windows. Please remember that cars heat up quickly, even on cool days this can pose a serious danger to pets, children, and the elderly.
- **POOL SAFETY** Similar to having children in a pool area, the same supervision guidelines apply to pets. It is recommended for family water safety that gates be installed and that locks be high up where they cannot be reached by children or pets.
- **WALKS** Sidewalks and streets heat up during the summer months and a good rule of thumb is "If it's too hot for the palm of your hand, it is too hot for your pet's paws." If you walk your dog at night, make sure to wear reflective or light-colored clothing and use a light reflecting leash, harness, or collar on your pet. Although we know you love your pets, not everyone else walking is interested in them. Please keep dogs on leash when walking, hiking or in the park. Always ask permission before petting another person's animal.
- **PESTICIDES/TOXINS** There are many plants, household cleaners and foods that may be harmful to your pet and other wildlife. For information on harmful products, contact your local animal poison hotline or the ASPCA at (888) 426-4435.
- **CLEAN-UP** Please carry dog waste bags or use the bag-dispenser stations around the City to pick up your pet's waste. Please dispose of it properly to keep our city and waterways clean!

GREEN TIP: What is Composting and How do I Start?

Composting is the decomposition of plant remains and other once-living materials to make an earthy, dark, crumbly substance that is excellent for adding to houseplants or enriching garden soil. It is a way to recycle your yard and kitchen waste and is a critical step in reducing the volume of garbage needlessly sent to landfills for disposal.



City residents are eligible to receive one free tumbler-type home composting container. There are a limited number of units available per year so call now! Residents may request the tumbler by calling (805) 955-4342. There is a \$35 delivery fee and home assembly required.
