### SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM OFFERS AFFORDABLE CAMP WESTLAKE AND SPECIALTY CAMPS

The City will once again be offering a comprehensive Summer Recreation Program for young residents. Now in its thirtieth year, the program features affordable summer recreation activities for children ages 5-15. The fun kicks off on June 18 and runs through August 10. Residents may sign up for Camp Westlake Village for weekly summer camp options for \$50 a week or an entire 8 weeks of summer camp for only \$400. The Summer Academy offers week-long specialty camps in areas such as theater, Legos, cooking, computers, robots, and science.

# SUMMER ENTERTAINMENT SERIES CELEBRATES 15 YEARS BEGINNING JUNE 1

The City of Westlake Village kicks off its 15th season of summer entertainment on Friday, June 1. The series begins with "Jazz Night." The multi-award winning jazz bands from both Lindero Canyon Middle School and Agoura High School will be performing. The performance starts at 7:00 pm. Food truck service will be on-site offering family-friendly dinners for sale.

"Jazz Night" is part of a series of seven special events sponsored by the City of Westlake Village that is geared for the entire family. Upcoming "TGIF" events at the Civic Center include "Tale As Old As Time", a night of Disney Music under the stars with 5-STAR THEATRICALS on June 29 and a musical night with "The Rat Pack" featuring portrayals of Dean Martin, Sammy Davis Jr., and Frank Sinatra on August 10.

In addition to these three events, the City is proud to continue the "Saturdays in the Park" events. This summer entertainment series will feature four events on Saturday nights at Berniece Bennett Park. The Saturday programs kick off on June 16 with "Wanted", a tribute to "Bon Jovi". Additional concerts will feature "The Long Run," a tribute to "The Eagles" on July 14 and "ABBA FAB," a tribute to ABBA on August 25. "Saturdays in the Park" concerts begin at 7:00 pm. The additional Saturday event is a "Movie in the Park" night featuring "ET" on July 28. The outdoor movie will begin at approximately 8:00 pm but activities for the whole family will begin at 6:00 pm.

The three TGIF events on Friday evenings are held at the Westlake Village Civic Center, 31200 Oak Crest Drive. The four "Saturdays in the Park" events will be held at Berniece Bennett Park, 31800 Village Center Road. These outdoor performances are free to the public and families are encouraged to attend. Please bring lawn chairs and picnic baskets for these delightful early evening summer performances. As the temperatures drop in the early evening hours, don't forget to bring your sweater or jacket. Food will be available for sale at each event starting at 6:00 pm. ## DIAL-A-RIDE EXPANDS ITS SERVICE AREA

Dial-A-Ride is a service for residents over the age of 65 or those with a disability that prevents them from driving. Rides are available throughout the Cities of Westlake Village and Thousand Oaks, and service has now expanded to Oak Park and Agoura Hills. Eligible residents need to obtain a free Dial-A-Ride card from City Hall. The City offers the program through a contract agreement with the City of Thousand Oaks with service 7 days a week. ## VILLAGE TROLLEY ROLLS BACK THROUGH TOWN BEGINNING MAY 25

The "Village Trolley" returns on May 25 providing free transportation between Westlake Village neighborhoods, retail areas, and restaurants. The trolley will be operating on Friday and Saturday nights from 3:00 to 10:00 pm through September 1.



Riding the "Village Trolley" is easy. Simply hop on and off at any one of the fifteen stops around town. The trolley is outfitted with a GPS locator device allowing riders to use their smartphone to track the trolley's progress. The trolley is not just transportation. Every night from 6:00 to 8:00 pm, the City provides free entertainment on the trolley to make your ride that much more enjoyable. Check the City's website for the up-to-date entertainment schedule. The "Village Trolley" is the perfect way to get to TGIF at the Civic Center and Saturday Concerts in the Park. A special Berniece Bennett Park pick-up/drop-off will be offered on June 16, July 14, July 28, and August 25 to coincide with those Saturday events. ## LEASH LAW IN WESTLAKE VILLAGE

The City of Westlake Village requires that all dogs be kept on a leash and under the control of their owners at all times when in an area accessible to the public. This includes public parks, schools, streets and private common areas open to the public. Any dog found roaming without a leash can be picked up by Los Angeles County Animal Control and the owner can be subject to fines. The law helps prevent dogs from getting seriously injured or lost while protecting residents.

## PUBLIC SAFETY CORNER: ARE YOUR DOGS AND CATS LICENSED?

California State Law and the Westlake Village Municipal Code require that all dogs and cats over the age of four months be licensed. Annual license fees are \$30 for unaltered dogs, \$15 for altered dogs, and \$7.50 for altered dogs owned by residents 60 years of age and older. Annual license fees are \$10 for unaltered cats and \$5 for altered cats. Proof of the owner's age will be required if applying for the senior citizen rate for altered dogs. There is a penalty fee of \$30 for dogs and \$10 for cats for failure to apply for a license or if the owner has allowed a license to lapse.

If you have not obtained a license or if it has lapsed, please visit the LA County Agoura Animal Shelter at 29525 Agoura Road in Agoura Hills. Shelter hours are Monday through Thursday, noon to 7:00 p.m., and Friday through Sunday, 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The Shelter is closed on holidays. Dog owners should bring proof of rabies vaccination and sterilization, if applicable, to the Shelter.

Dog licenses are valid for one year. Existing licenses may be renewed on-line at <http://animalcare.lacounty.gov> with a credit or debit card payment or by submitting a renewal by mail.

Licensing is an important means of identification and can help residents find their pet if it becomes lost. The Shelter staff rescues lost pets and makes every effort to reunite animals with their owners. Revenue generated by the sale of licenses helps to pay for Animal Care and Control services in Westlake Village. Westlake Village receives 100% of all revenue from license sales as a credit against the cost of providing animal regulation services in the City.

# 2018 HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN COMMUNITY SURVEY

The Las Virgenes-Malibu Council of Governments (LVMCOG) is in the process of updating the Hazard Mitigation Plan for the cities of Agoura Hills, Calabasas, Hidden Hills, Malibu, and Westlake Village. As part of this process, the LVMCOG is reaching out to the community to allow for public input on the plan. Public involvement is a key requirement for this effort and a survey has been developed to provide a platform for local residents to voice their opinions about their disaster preparedness needs and concerns.

Please visit the City's website under the News Flash section to access the survey. The data gathered will be used to help local officials better plan for disasters, and it is a vital component in developing local mitigation steps that will help in reducing the risk of loss to lives and property. The survey is scheduled to run between April 6 to May 31, 2018. The results of the survey along with the updated Hazard Mitigation Plan will be published later this year.
